

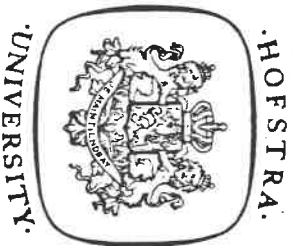

ABSTRACT: Examination of the Hippie movement as a sociological phenomenon.

EVALUATION: It has been a source of personal pleasure and professional gratification to me to work as Mrs. Jones' supervisor on her independent study project in the course of the past year. It is my overall opinion that her study of the "Hippie Highway" represents in quality, comprehensiveness and research methodology, the kind of contribution that in many universities would qualify for a master's degree. She has demonstrated thorough comprehension of the contemporary literature in this most difficult area and she has supplemented her library research with extensive interviews and field work utilizing the participant observer technique and critical selection from amongst the many historic materials on the pre-cursors of this quasi-movement.
